The Government continues to make available a sum of money annually to allow schools to continue to develop sports provision within their school and to help schools increase pupil participation in sporting activity. This funding should continue until the academic year 2019/2020.

The Sports Premium Funding is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

At Vale School our aims are:

- Increased participation in competitive sports and inter-school tournaments;
- Increased opportunity for pupils of all abilities to participate in a range of sports and physical activity;
- Improved enjoyment in sport and increased uptake of sporting opportunities.
- Improved resources and facilities for PE and school sport;
- Improved PE teaching through the development of teachers and other providers;
